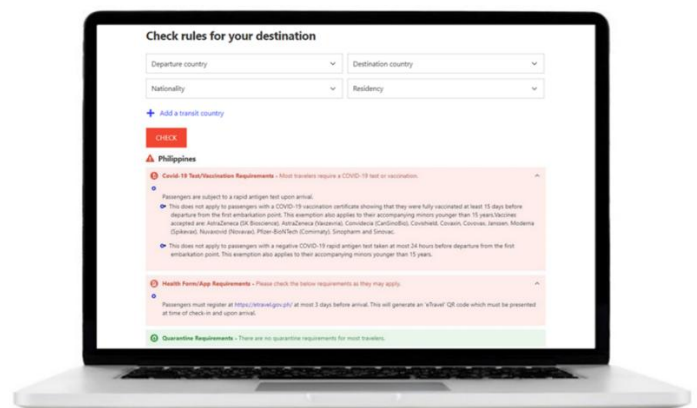

<p>Entry Requirements</p> <p>ZRH —————→ PVG</p> <p>Visa requirements Click here for more information.</p> <p>Destination Shanghai PVG China</p> <p>Visa required.</p> <p>Visa issuance: Passengers with a Port Visa Notification can obtain a visa on arrival at the port which issued the notification.</p> <p>Passport requirements Click here for more information.</p> <p>Destination Shanghai PVG China</p> <p>Passport required.</p> <p>Document Validity: Passports and other documents accepted for entry must be valid on arrival.</p> <p>Public Health and Vaccinations Click here for more information.</p> <p>Destination Shanghai PVG China</p> <p>Requirement (Health): Passengers arriving within 6 days after leaving or transiting countries with risk of yellow fever transmission and not holding a yellow fever vaccination certificate are subject to vaccination and quarantine upon arrival.</p> <p>Exempt from Yellow Fever vaccination: Passengers transiting countries with risk of yellow fever transmission if not leaving the transit areas.</p> <p>Recommended: Since 2017, no indigenous cases have been reported. Recommended prevention in risk areas: A.</p> <p>The WHO recommended type of prevention is referred to as: - Type A (very limited risk of malaria transmission) - Mosquito bite prevention only. - Type B (risk of non-falciparum malaria) - Mosquito-bite prevention plus chloroquine or doxycycline or atovaquone-proguanil or mefloquine chemoprophylaxis. - Type C (risk of P. falciparum malaria) - Mosquito-bite prevention plus atovaquone-proguanil or doxycycline or mefloquine chemoprophylaxis. Chemoprophylaxis should be started preferably one week before departure and no later than the first day of exposure; it must be taken with unfailing regularity and continued for 4 weeks after the last exposure. No prophylactic regimen is 100% protective against infection, but even if it fails to prevent the disease it may, nevertheless, render the infection milder and less life threatening.</p>	<p>Entry Requirements</p> <p>ZRH —————→ IAD</p> <p>Visa requirements Click here for more information.</p> <p>Destination Washington IAD USA</p> <p>Visa required.</p> <p>Visa Exemptions: Passengers with an Authorization for Parole of an Alien into the United States (Form I-512). Passengers with an Authorization to Transport for Parole of a Noncitizen into the United States (Form I-512L). Passengers with a Boarding Foil issued by the USA. Immediate family members of nationals of Ecuador traveling under the Family Reunification Parole (FRP) process. They must: - have an approved Advance Travel Authorization (ATA) issued by U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) to seek parole; and - have a valid passport; and - travel together with the national of Ecuador or contact the U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP). Immediate family members may be of any nationality and are limited to spouse or common-law partner and unmarried children under the age of 21.</p> <p>Passport requirements Click here for more information.</p> <p>Destination Washington IAD USA</p> <p>Passport required.</p> <p>Passport Exemptions: Nationals of Philippines with an emergency passport.</p> <p>Document Validity: Passports issued to nationals of Philippines must be valid for the period of intended stay. When nationals of Philippines travel with an emergency passport, it must be valid for the period of intended stay.
